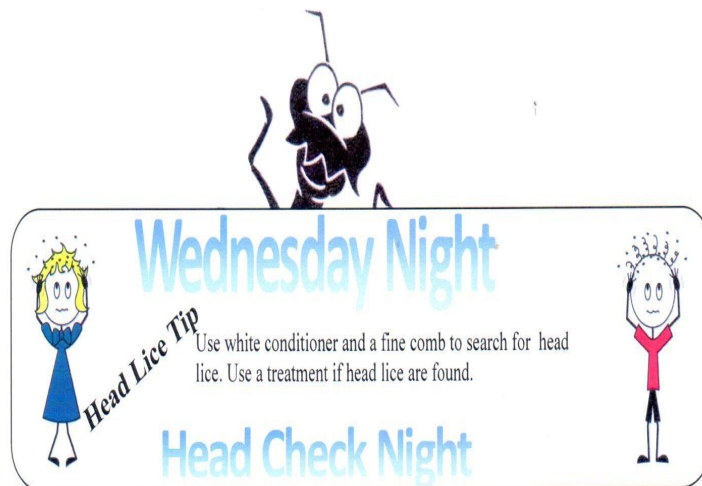
PREMIER SPELLING BEE
