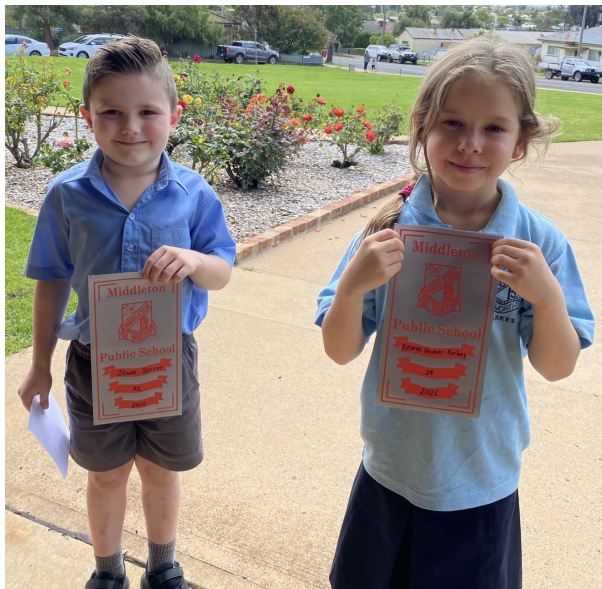

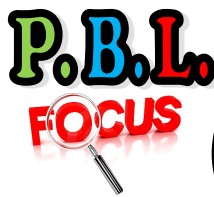
SILVER PENNANTS

All orders and payments will occur online, so there will be **no need** to send the kids in with cash!

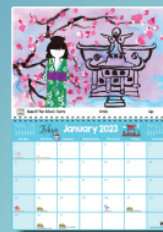
